LifeServe has actually been on the forefront of Convalescent Plasma and the fight of COVID in the country, and he wanted to see first hand how we run our operation and our relationship with the State of Iowa. We have committed to, and opened, two new donor center locations in the Des Moines Metro! With the trend doing a drastic shift because of the pandemic, more focus is now having donor centers more readily available for donors (instead of focusing on mobile blood drives). So we now have a location in the Somerfield Village of West Des Moines, as well as a location in Ankeny off of Delaware Avenue.
